First Impressions

- Possible Concern
 - We want guests to experience a worship service first.
 - They may feel like church is boring if a lecture-style class is their first impression.
- Possible Solutions
 - Create a separate space for teaching apart from the sanctuary.
 - Invest in signage which clearly promotes a worship service following class.
 - Invite guests to the worship service first. After their first visit, let them know about the adult class.





We Don't Have Anything to Teach.

- Possible Concern
 - We don't have time to write our own curriculum.
- Possible Solutions
 - Teach pre-produced curriculum, such as God's Word for Life.
 - Since you don't have to start from a blank screen, you have more time to make the curriculum your own through deeper study and research.

We Don't Have Any Students.

- Possible Concern
 - Adults are not interested in an adult, lecture-style Sunday school class.
- Possible Solutions
 - Adopt a small group format with space for discussion and dialogue.
 - Even in a large group, divide the class up for discussion and interaction with the lesson.
 - Poll nearby churches with thriving adult Sunday school classes for more ideas in your area.
